**YES**

**Prop. 13 - Limits on Property Tax Assessment. Seismic retrofitting of existing buildings. Legislative Constitutional Amendment.** Provides that construction or installation in existing buildings of certain seismic retrofitting improvements or improvements utilizing earthquake hazard mitigation technologies, will not trigger reassessment of property tax value. Prop. 13 would, at least, provide some long-term tax relief for property owners who are trying to do the right thing by making their buildings safer. A win-win situation for all!

**Prop. 14 - California Top Two Primaries Act:** A similar measure, Prop. 62 in 2004, was defeated by 54-46%. If this Act were approved, only the top two candidates in a congressional or state election would be in a general election. Candidates DO NOT have to list their party affiliation. This would impose the potential for infringement upon those parties', as well as third parties', First Amendment rights of association. It would completely eliminate write-in candidates chances of winning an election. The top-two system increases the cost of campaigns because it forces candidates to run, in effect, two campaigns in front of the entire electorate (assuming they qualify for the second round). This measure reduces choice in elections and makes general elections more about personalities than issues.

**Prop. 15 - California Fair Elections Act:**

**Prop. 15 repeals California's existing voter-approved ban on public financing of campaigns** AND may be in conflict with Prop. 14. Section 4 of Article XVIII of the California Constitution decrees, "If provision of 2 or more measures approved at the same election conflict, those of the measure receiving the highest affirmative vote shall prevail." These two election law measures do not fit together. Prop. 15 has at least eight sections that presume that political parties nominate candidates for state office and that independent candidates do not appear on the primary ballot; however, Prop. 14 sets up a scheme under which parties would not have nominees for state office and also provides that candidates would run in the primary. Prop. 15 is so convoluted that it should be defeated!

The state Legislature put Pro. 15 on the ballot when it passed AB 586 in 2008, authored by then-Assemblywoman Loni Hancock (D-Berkeley). **Prop. 15 repeals the voter-approved ban on public financing of campaigns** and imposes a new tax on lobbyists, lobbying firms and lobbyist employers to pay for a pilot program that would use public money to finance campaigns for Secretary of State in 2014 and 2018. **While the pilot program sunsets after two election cycles, the ban on public campaign financing is repealed permanently.** California voters have already rejected public campaign financing in no uncertain terms. In 2006, 74% of voters opposed Proposition 89; in 2000, two thirds of voters said NO to public campaign financing when Proposition 25 was defeated.

**Prop. 16 - The Taxpayers' Right to Vote Act. Constitutional Amendment:** The title of this Act is misleading as it has nothing to do with anyone's right to vote. It is entirely about Pacific Gas and Electric (PG&E's) financial interests and would do considerable harm to local governments' ability to create and/or expand publicly-owned utilities for the benefit of electricity customers. Prop. 16 IMPOSES a two-thirds vote, as well as an expensive election requirement, on local governments before they contract with alternative suppliers of electricity. These outrageous requirements seal in PG&E's monopoly of supplying electricity. Voters need to reject Prop. 16 to protect their own pocketbooks and local choices about electricity service AND to send a strong message to PG&E, and other special interests, that the voters cannot be bought!

**Prop. 17 - Allows Auto Insurance Companies to Base Their Prices in Part on a Driver's History of Insurance Coverage. Initiative Statute:**

The largest backer of this measure is Mercury Insurance which has supplied 98% of the funding, so far. This is, essentially, the latest attempt by Mercury to eviscerate Proposition 103, the 1988 voter-approved ballot measure that dramatically re-shaped insurance regulation in California by giving an elected insurance commissioner the authority to approve property and casualty rates before they go into effect. Circumvention of Prop. 103 will allow insurance companies to increase cost of insurance to drivers who do not have an history of continuous insurance coverage. In other states where Mercury Insurance does business, it charges "whopping surcharges" to customers who have had a lapse in their coverage. In this terrible economy, passage of Prop. 17 could put more un-insured drivers on the road because they cannot pay for higher premiums.
